

#### **Types of Bullying**

Cyber Bullying - The Cyberbullying Research Centre defines cyber bullying as: Intentional and repeated harm inflicted through the use of computers, phones, and other electronic devices. Cyber bullying can be overt or covert bullying behaviours using digital technologies, including hardware such as computers and smartphones, and software such as social media, instant messaging, texts, websites and other online platforms. Cyber bullying can happen at any time. It can be in public or in private and sometimes only known to the target and the person bullying. Cyber bullying can include: - abusive or hurtful texts, emails or posts, images or videos - deliberately excluding others online - nasty gossip or rumours - imitating others online or using their log-in
