

Dear parents, careers and students,

At Springhurst Primary School, we believe that a uniform promotes a sense of belonging, equality and school pride. The uniform has been designed to take account of comfort, flexibility, ease of care and cost. The basic colours are navy blue and yellow. There are a number of choices within the uniform range that students can make to meet the school's requirements. As determined by School Council, it is expected that full school uniform will be worn by all students.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to outline Springhurst Primary School's requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and exemption processes. This dress code has been developed by Springhurst Primary School's School Council in close consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of our community.

Springhurst Primary School's Student Dress Code aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- support Springhurst Primary School's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities.
- reduce student competition on the basis of clothing
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.

The School Council has developed a dress code that we believe provides a range of choices for students and is cost effective for families.

SCOPE

Students are expected to comply with this Student Dress Code while traveling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities.

UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE

The full list of Springhurst Primary School's compulsory school uniform items are available at Appendix A to this policy.

General appearance

While at school, travelling to or from school or participating in school activities, Example School students must comply with the following:

- Uniforms must be clean and in good repair
- Uniforms must be clearly marked with the owner's name
- Additional layers of clothing may be worn underneath the uniform for added warmth.

Jewellery and cosmetics

Students are not permitted to wear decorative jewellery to school. Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, and watches, are the only acceptable jewellery.

Hair and Sun safety

Shoulder length or longer hair is to be tied back to help restrict the spread of nits and lice and for student safety.

School uniform hats must be worn outside in Terms 1 and 4 and on any other day prescribed by the school. School uniform hats may also be worn outside of this time period, by parent or student choice.

Hats are not to be worn inside.

Students are permitted to wear sunglasses during outdoor activities. Sunglasses should be close-fitting, wrap-around that meet the Australian Standards 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

PURCHASE OF UNIFORMS

Uniform items can be purchased from Steers Co. There is currently no available method of purchase at school. Parents are advised to order it directly from Steers Co at 52 Norton Street, Wangaratta.

Springhurst Primary School has a range of donated clothing items for families. Please discuss with the principal or classroom teacher if you would like to access this.

Support for families experiencing difficulty

Please contact the Principal or your child's classroom teacher to discuss support that we may be able to provide to families experiencing difficulty meeting uniform costs, including information about eligibility for uniform support through State Schools' Relief. Springhurst Primary School also has uniforms available to families to borrow on request.

IMPLEMENTATION

Springhurst Primary School will ensure that this Student Dress Code is communicated to all families and students through our website and social media channels. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible.

Students wearing non-compliant uniform items may be asked to change into a compliant item of clothing provided by the school.

If a student is out of school uniform or otherwise breaches the Student Dress Code on a recurring basis, a note will be provided to the student and parents by the classroom teacher. If non-compliance with the dress code becomes a continued occurrence, the Principal will be informed and a phone call home may be required. In this event, the school will continue to work with the student and family to support compliance.



EXEMPTIONS TO STUDENT DRESS CODE

We recognize that there may be situations where the application of this dress code may affect students unequally.

Students and their parents or carers may apply in writing to the Principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

- an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic or cultural beliefs or background
- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires a departure from the dress code
- the student or their parents/carers can demonstrate particular economic hardship that prevents them from complying with the dress code.

When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:

- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.

The Principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents or carers.

[NOTE: The Department's policy on Student Dress Codes requires the Principal or delegate to provide written reasons when not allowing an exemption. It also states that the Principal is responsible for managing and conducting the exemption process. In exceptional circumstances another staff member at the school or regional office may be appointed to consider an exemption request.]

Review cycle

This Student Dress Code was last amended by School Council on 3/5/2019 and is scheduled for review in 2022.

NOTE: The Department's Student Dress Code policy requires school councils to decide annually whether or not amendments or a full review of the dress code is required.



APPENDIX A: SPRINGHURST PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIFORM ITEMS

All year round

The following items may be worn all year round, with either the summer or winter uniform:

Jumper or Vest

Navy blue polar fleece with school logo

Navy polar/vest fleece with school logo

Polo shirts

Yellow long and short-sleeved with school logo.

Skorts

Plain navy skorts without decoration or brand name and in winter can be worn with navy blue tights/stockings.

Socks or tights/stockings

Grey or white socks

Navy blue tights/stockings

Footwear

Appropriate footwear is to be worn. Summer sandals with covered toes, black or brown school shoes or pull on school boots or runners are permitted. No thongs or open-toed sandals are permitted.

Chosen footwear should be in a presentable condition without holes or visible wear.

School Rain Coat (Optional Item)

Navy Blue coat



Headwear

Navy blue, yellow or white headbands, hair ribbons, "scrunchies" or headwear worn as part of cultural/religious beliefs. Elastic Bands used to tie up hair may be worn in any colour.

Summer Uniform - to be worn in Terms 1 and 4

Dresses

Summer blue and white checked dress

Shorts

Plain navy-blue shorts without decoration or brand name

Skorts

Plain navy skorts without decoration or brand name

Winter Uniform - to be worn in Term 2 and 3

Pants

Plain, navy blue track pants without decoration or brand name

Skivvies

Plain yellow skivvy

Hats - to be worn from Term 1 and Term 4

Navy broadbrim without decoration or brand name. School logo and name preferable. Hats are encouraged all year round.

Sports Uniform

There are specific uniform requirements for students participating in sports. Students are encouraged to wear comfortable shoes and regular school uniform on days in which they have sports.
