Sporting Schools

This term for Sporting Schools, we are very lucky to be going ten pin bowling. We are having four sessions at the Wangaratta Supa Bowl at the Co-store . Each of these sessions is on a Friday – we will leave school at 10.30 and our lessons will be from 11 – 12. Following bowling, we thought we might have lunch in at King George Gardens. There will be no cost for students.

Foundation/One

We have made a great start to the year with all the students settling in really well. By next week, we should have our new reader covers and reading log books ready for the students to take home. Each week, students take home 5 readers to read during the week. We don't expect every book to be read every night – just the one will do. It would be great if you could initial and write a comment if you want to let us know the reader has been read. We hear the students read each day – by you listening to your child read it reinforces what we have done at school.

Also in the reader cover is a list of sight words. These are common words found in their readers and it is vital for the students to be able to read these words automatically to become proficient readers. When they have successfully read the words about 5 – 6 times, they will get a new list. We would like these practised each night as well.

The strategy in reading this week is 'Chunky Monkey.' This is used when a student comes to an unfamiliar word and is able to break it into syllables to work out the word.

In Maths we are doing some revision from last year with the Foundation students doing the numbers from 1 to 5.

Show and Tell will be on Fridays. Your child can bring along something to share if they like.

If you have any questions, please contact me or jot a note down in your child's reading log book.

 Rural City of Wangaratta

Community groups keen to reconnect can now apply for funding for events.

The Rural City of Wangaratta has established the Community Connection Events Fund and is encouraging groups to apply. Events that promote groups, connect community members or help build resilience and social connections are eligible for the funding of up to \$1000. Mayor Dean Rees said this was an effective way of getting people and community groups back together.

"Community Connections have suffered over the past year, and it's our connections that help to make us resilient," he said.

"Ties to our family, friends and community provide a sense of security and belonging, and it helps give us the capacity to handle difficult life events.

"To all the community groups out there we really encourage you to come forward with ideas and help take the lead in rebuilding connections."
